



How to embed a video on Moodle

TIP: For learning purposes, it is often better to simply give students the link to your video. If you embed a video, it loses its full Panopto ReView capabilities, such as search, speed control and indexing.

- 1) Find the course that you want to embed the video into and click it.

- 2) Turn editing on (top right-hand corner).

- 3) Find the topic that you want to place the video into.

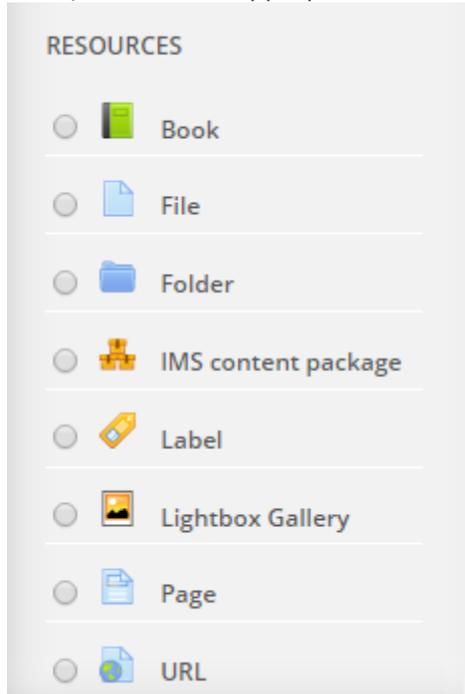

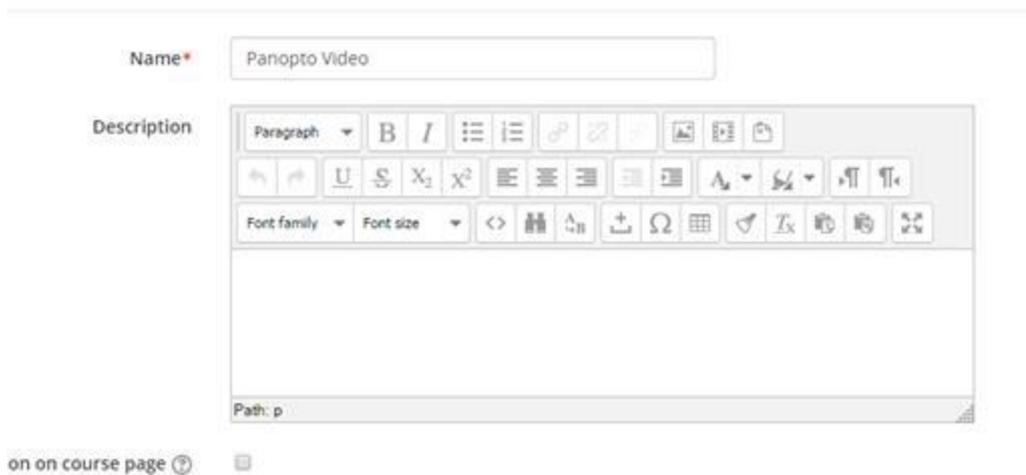
- 4) Click on the 'Add an activity or resource' button.

5) Choose an appropriate 'Resource' to place the video into – a 'Page' is suitable. Click **Add**.

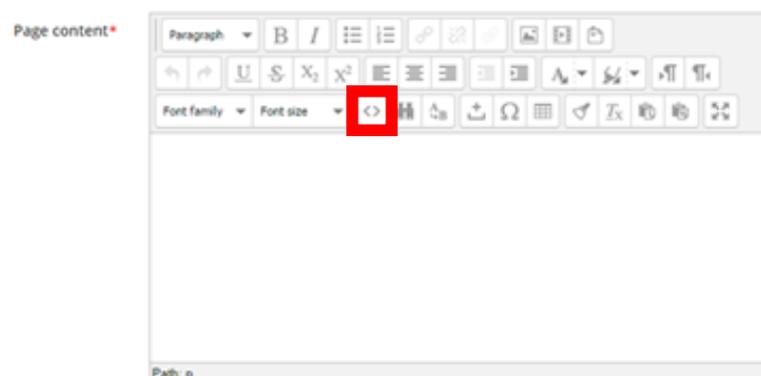


6) Give your video a name and description.



7) Underneath, you'll find the 'Content' page. Click on the embed HTML code button, which looks like two angled brackets < >

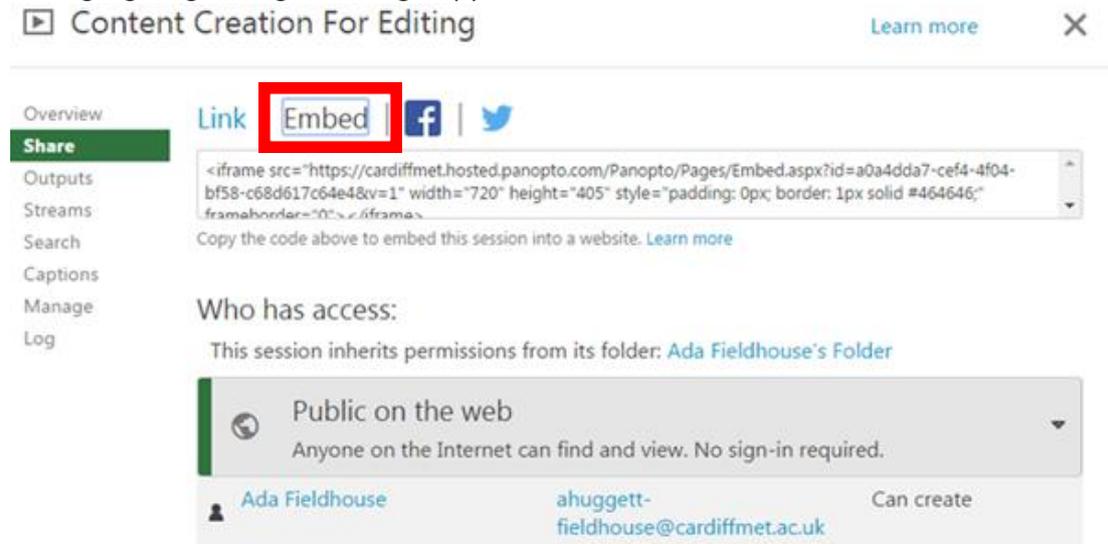

- 8) In a separate Browser window/tab, open the Panopto ReView web viewer, and open the appropriate folder. Hover over the relevant video and grey icons will appear. Click 'Share'



- 9) A pop-up will take you to a 'Share' tab. Click the 'Embed' button at the top of the screen and the URL link will change into HTML embed code. Copy this onto your clipboard by highlighting and right-clicking 'copy'



- 10) Returning to the Moodle tab, you'll see the HTML source editor has opened. Use CTRL+V to paste the HTML embed code. Click 'Update'.



TIP: Moodle will only allow you to paste by using the keyboard shortcut, CTRL+V and therefore right-clicking will not work.

11) At the bottom of the page, click 'Save and Display' to check that the video has embedded correctly.
