# **Cardiff Metropolitan University helps boost sales by introducing sustainable manufacturing methods at Sevenoaks Modular.**

## **The Sponsors**

The Welsh Government and Innovate UK have invested in a diverse range of programmes to encourage and support industry-university collaboration. The longest established scheme is Knowledge Transfer Partnerships (KTP), which for nearly 50 years has helped businesses to innovate and grow by collaborating with a university to bring in new skills and the latest academic thinking to deliver a specific strategic innovation project.

KTP projects involve three key parties, a business, a university and a recent university graduate or Associate who is employed for the agreed duration of the project. The Associate, under the supervision of a university academic, transfers new knowledge from the university to help the business innovate and grow.

## **About the Sevenoaks Modular and Cardiff Metropolitan University KTP project**

One industry-business collaboration is the highly successful KTP project between Sevenoaks Modular in Neath, and the Sustainable and Resilient Built Environment Research Group at Cardiff Metropolitan University. This project has optimised the design for manufacture, offsite manufacturing and erection of timber-frame closed panels for modern methods of construction (MMC) systems including walls, roofs and floors and developed a new modular MMC system. All the existing and new MMC systems use natural and renewable woodfibre and sheep wool insulation. This has pioneered the development of resilient, sustainable, and cost-effective prefabricated homebuilding in Wales for healthier occupants.

The collaboration with Cardiff Metropolitan University has supported Sevenoaks Modular in the UK to be at the forefront of innovative housebuilding solutions within the construction industry and to develop new products that are sustainable and cost-effective to produce. This has enabled the business to grow whilst at the same time ensuring it remains environmentally responsible by minimising its carbon emissions.

A total of £8.5m of sales turnover can be attributable to the KTP with a projected £28m to be resulting from the KTP in three years' time. This is due to the Welsh Government being committed to spending more than £1bn on building new social housing over three years (2022-2025) to meet the projected housing need. With Sevenoaks having a 28% market share and the expected growth in the market.

## **The Company**

Established in 1996, Sevenoaks Modular has grown from a family business employing a small number of staff to a company with over one hundred and fifty employees. From the success of the KTP Sevenoaks became the largest offsite manufacturer of timber frame MMC systems in Wales in 2023 and is a market leading designer and manufacturer of sustainable timber frame components, supplying major national housebuilders, contractors, and housing associations across the UK.

The sustainability and impact on the environment of the products it manufactures is key for Sevenoaks Modular. Sustainability, together with its goals to recruit new staff and generate further growth are planned. These objectives are in alignment with the 2015 Well-Being of Future Generations Act, which aims to create a more globally responsible, prosperous and resilient Wales.

## Y Noddwyr

Mae Llywodraeth Cymru ac Innovate UK wedi buddsoddi mewn ystod amrywiol o raglenni i annog a chefnogi cydweithredu rhwng diwydiant a phrifysgolion. Y cynllun sydd wedi'i sefydlu ers yr amser hiraf yw Partneriaethau Trosglwyddo Gwybodaeth (PTG) sydd ers bron i 50 mlynedd wedi helpu busnesau i arloesi a thyfu trwy gydweithio â phrifysgol drwy ddod â sgiliau newydd a'r meddylfryd academaidd diweddaraf i mewn i gyflwyno prosiect arloesi strategol penodol.

Mae prosiectau PTG yn cynnwys tri pharti allweddol, busnes, prifysgol a myfyriwr sydd wedi graddio'n ddiweddar neu'n Gydymaith sy'n cael ei gyflogi am gyfnod cytunedig o amser. Mae'r Cydymaith, o dan oruchwyliaeth academydd prifysgol, yn trosglwyddo gwybodaeth newydd o'r brifysgol i helpu'r busnes i arloesi a thyfu.

## Ynglŷn â phrosiect Modiwlaidd Sevenoaks a Phrifysgol Metropolitan Caerdydd

Un cydweithrediad diwydiant-busnes yw'r prosiect PTG hynod Iwyddiannus rhwng Sevenoaks Modular yng Nghastell-nedd, a'r grŵp ymchwil Amgylchedd Adeiledig Cynaliadwy a Gwydn ym Met Caerdydd. Mae'r prosiect hwn wedi optimeiddio'r dyluniad ar gyfer gweithgynhyrchu, gweithgynhyrchu oddi ar y safle a chodi paneli caeedig ffrâm bren ar gyfer systemau dulliau modern o adeiladu (MMC) gan gynnwys waliau, toeau a lloriau ac wedi datblygu system MMC fodiwlaid newydd. Mae'r holl systemau MMC presennol a newydd yn defnyddio inswleiddio ffibr pren a gwlan defaid naturiol ac adnewyddadwy. Mae hyn wedi arloesi datblygiad adeiladu tai parod gwydn, cynaliadwy a chost-effeithiol yng Nghymru ar gyfer preswylwyr iachach.

Mae'r cydweithrediad â Prifysgol Metropolitan Caerdydd wedi cefnogi Modiwlaidd Sevenoaks yn y DU i fod ar flaen y gad o ran datrysiau adeiladu tai arloesol o fewn y diwydiant adeiladu ac i ddatblygu cynhyrchion newydd sy'n gynaliadwy ac yn gost-effeithiol i'w cynhyrchu. Mae hyn wedi galluogi'r busnes i dyfu ac i sicrhau ei fod yn parhau i fod yn amgylcheddol gyfrifol trwy leihau ei allyriadau carbon.

Gellir priodoli cyfanswm o £8.5m o drosiant gwerthiant i'r PTG a rhagwelir y bydd £28m yn deillio o'r PTG ymheng tair blynedd. Mae hyn oherwydd bod Llywodraeth Cymru wedi ymrwymo i wario mwy na £1bn ar adeiladu tai cymdeithasol newydd dros dair blynedd (2022-2025) i ddiwallu'r angen tai rhagamcanol. Gyda Sevenoaks â chyfran o'r farchnad o 28% a'r twf disgwyliedig yn y farchnad.

## Y cwmni

Wedi'i sefydlu ym 1996, mae Sevenoaks Modular wedi tyfu o fod yn fusnes teuluol sy'n cyflogi nifer fach o staff i fod yn gwmni gyda dros gant a hanner o weithwyr. O ganlyniad i lwyddiant y PTG daeth Sevenoaks yn wneuthurwr systemau ffrâm bren MMC oddi ar y safle mwyaf yng Nghymru yn 2023 ac mae'n ddylunydd a gwneuthurwr cydrannau ffrâm bren cynaliadwy sy'n arwain y farchnad, gan gyflenwi adeiladwyr tai cenedlaethol mawr, contractwyr, a chymdeithasau tai ledled y DU.

Mae cynaliadwyedd ac effaith y cynhyrchion y mae'n eu gweithgynhyrchu ar yr amgylchedd yn allweddol i Sevenoaks Modular. Mae cynaliadwyedd, ynghyd â'i nodau i recriwtio staff newydd a chynhyrchu twf pellach yn yr arfaeth. Mae'r amcanion hyn yn cyd-fynd â Deddf Llesiant Cenedlaethau'r Dyfodol 2015, sy'n anelu at greu Cymru sy'n fwy cyfrifol, ffyniannus a chydnerth yn fyd-eang.
