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Empowering leaders: Exploring the impact of Cardiff Metropolitan University's 20Twenty Leadership Programme

What is the 20Twenty leadership programme?

The 20Twenty Leadership Programme is a programme delivered by Cardiff Metropolitan University's Creative Leadership and Enterprise Centre (CLEC), in collaboration with the Chartered Management Institute (CMI).

Launched in 2009, with EU funding until 2023, the programme aimed to provide practical, people-orientated management skills, and help business leaders deliver profitable growth through encouraging an adaptable and flexible mindset towards change and providing the skills required to compete in an increasingly difficult trading environment.

Key successes

- 1,812 accreditations achieved by participants from over 1,100 businesses.
- All success metrics for the 20Twenty programme were successfully achieved.
- 90% of the funding for 20Twenty has come from sponsors, including the Welsh and UK Governments and the EU.

CLEC's journey of leadership development

CLEC has worked with over 1,100 businesses and 1,420 managers through its 20Twenty Leadership Programme, resulting in 1,812 accreditations. These include 802 Post-Graduate Certificates (PGC) and CMI Level 7 certifications, as well as 208 CMI Level 4 certifications.

The 10-month programme, delivered over ten days, which features workshops, assignments, and a Strategic Growth Project (SGP), allows participants to earn leadership certifications at CMI Levels 4, 5, and 7, and a Cardiff Metropolitan University PGC in Sustainable Leadership. Graduates have the opportunity to advance their qualifications further by pursuing a Cardiff Metropolitan University Executive MBA or achieving Chartered Manager accreditation.

Expansion and impact:

The success of 20Twenty led to several programme expansions:

- **Construction Futures Wales (CFW):** Developed from 20Twenty, this £1.2 million programme, funded by the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB) and Welsh Government, supported over 300 businesses until 2018.
- **Help To Grow:** Given CLEC's experience in providing Leadership Training, and the School's endorsement by the Small Business Charter, CLEC was appointed as a local provider on the UK Government's £520m Help To Grow programme.
- **Admiral Insurance:** A bespoke version of 20Twenty for Admiral Insurance saw participant-led Strategic Growth Projects driving innovation, with praise from Admiral's CEO.
- **Grant Thornton:** A successful partnership between CLEC and Grant Thornton saw the launch of the £750k Accelerated Growth Programme (AGP) funded by Cardiff Capital Region, offering tailored one-to-one support to 75 participants.

Building strong networks

CLEC has established relationships with over 1,000 businesses across South and North East Wales. Its Alumni programme fosters interdisciplinary collaboration with key partners such as Admiral, NatWest, Bank of Wales, Chambers Wales, IoD, CBI Wales, FSB, and Grant Thornton.

International recognition

CLEC's impact has been internationally recognised. The 2021 Research Excellence Framework (REF2021) highlighted CLEC's achievements, and in 2022, the UK Productivity Commission extensively quoted CLEC research on productivity in its evidence gathering process. Independent evaluations have consistently confirmed the positive influence of CLEC's programmes, with its contributions to business and economic development noted in academic publications like Local Economy.
