Reserve Lists

Certain programmes at Cardiff Met including teacher training and certain health programmes are subject to targets from accrediting/professional bodies.

The number of offers made to these programmes considers these targets which change each year, the number of applicants who apply, accept and decline the offer, as well as the number of offer holders who do not meet the entry requirements when results are received.

We do however recognise that there are a number of applicants to whom we would have made an offer if there were unlimited places and for this reason, we offer a reserve list.

Who has a place on the reserve list

Applicants who meet the entry requirements and have the strongest score at interview will receive an offer of a place. Applicants whose performance was not as strong but still score highly will be made unsuccessful but are placed on the reserve list.

Reserve lists are constructed once interviews have taken place and being on the reserve list is no guarantee that an offer will be made.

Those applicants whose interview performance was not considered sufficient for further consideration for that year of entry will be made unsuccessful and not placed on the reserve list.

Applicants cannot request to be placed on the reserve list as not all meet the criteria and numbers vary each year in line with targets, offers made and overall scores.

How are applicants informed that they are on the reserve list

Applicants are informed if they have a place on the reserve list via email from the University. The decision received from UCAS will show as unsuccessful.

Do I need to do anything after receiving confirmation that I am on the reserve list?

Applicants do not need to take any action after receiving confirmation if they are on a reserve list unless they do not want to be placed on the reserve list.

If applicants do not wish to have their details recorded on the reserve list, they need to email askadmissions@cardiffmet.ac.uk and ask for their details to be removed.

Being placed on the reserve list is not a guarantee that an offer will be made later in the cycle and should not affect the decision to accept or decline other offers received from other institutions.

If additional offers can be made applicants will be contacted by the Admissions team at Cardiff Met to ask if applicants would like to receive an offer of a place. Offers will not be updated with UCAS until consent is received from applicants and the status of applicants allows an offer to be received.
