#### **Digital Skills Induction for Students**

The <u>Digital Essentials</u> induction provides new students with the core digital skills you need to study at Cardiff Met.

You will learn about the technologies and digital practices that enable you to undertake your studies remotely and in person. The induction explores essential systems such as Moodle, email, our app store, managing your documents and Microsoft Teams – the digital communication platform that will be central to your learning. Here's what you need to do:

1. Complete and pass the *Digital Essentials* induction e-lesson.

2. Attend and complete the *Introduction to Teams* and *Managing Documents at Cardiff Met* training sessions that build upon the induction e-lesson.

You can complete the Digital Essentials e-lesson any time, it should only take 25 minutes. We suggest completing it before you arrive at Cardiff Met.

You can also sign-up for the two training sessions, these will be held through a Microsoft Teams meeting in induction week and first two weeks of term.

#### Library induction

The <u>Library induction</u> explores how to access the resources and support that are designed to support you in your learning. It is an online induction, so you can complete it any time, it should take about 10 minutes to complete.

#### Develop your digital skills further

The Digital Essentials induction will develop the *basic* digital skills you will need; our <u>Digital</u> <u>Skills courses</u> develop them further.

Our Microsoft Office Specialist courses are comprehensive training courses for Excel, Word, PowerPoint and Outlook and lead to official Microsoft qualifications, all available to students **for free**. You can sample these courses by completing a <u>taster e-lesson</u> from each course.

The full programme of digital skills training - including the Office courses, Teams and document management training, web design, Photoshop, online survey design and more – will be announced via email in mid-September.

Always Sign in to MetSearch with your Cardiff Met login to make sure you see all the electronic books and journals as well as ones we have on the shelves. MetSearch will also tell you the location and availability of the print resources in our two Learning Centres.

<u>Getting help using the books and journals, and more</u> You can learn much more about how to get the very best out of our resources from our <u>Academic Practice</u> team.

Workshops are available throughout the academic year on a variety of topics such as identifying academic sources, writing successfully for assessments, and referencing. You'll find lots of resources on these topics on <u>Study Smart</u>.

#### **Personal Tutors at Cardiff Met**

Every student will have a personal tutor allocated to them during the induction period of your studies at Cardiff Met. Your personal Tutor will usually be an academic member of staff from your course.

Once you have been allocated a Personal Tutor, it's their responsibility to support you through your time here at Cardiff Met. They will support you through scheduled tutorial meetings which occur once per term, as a minimum.

This support can include discussing your academic achievements, areas which need improvement, or any personal issues you may be experiencing. No matter the query, your personal tutor will be able to signpost you to the most appropriate person or support within the university or beyond.

#### Your Student Met Card

Once your place is confirmed and you have completed your enrolment online, you will be able to upload a photo to be able to collect your student MetCard. Your card will give you access to campus facilities (Halls accommodation if you are a residential student), Library and IT services, Self-service printing and copying. You'll also need your MetCard if you join the University's <u>gym</u>.

Please find below the link which will enable you to upload a photograph so that you can be sent your MetCard.

Photo guidelines:

- clear and in focus in colour
- unaltered by computer software
- contain no other objects or people
- be taken against a plain light-coloured background
- The photo should show a head-and-shoulders
- The filetype you save it as should be .JPG. and less than 500KB in size.

### Photos uploaded before August 28<sup>th</sup> will ensure that your MetCard is pre-printed ready for your collection when you first arrive on campus in Welcome Week.

After this date, you will need to queue to have your photo taken and card printed in one the Welcome Week hubs on campus when you arrive.

#### Walk

#### Cycle

If you have your own bike then bring it to Uni and use it. Cardiff is an awesome city to cycle in and Cardiff Met won the Most Cycle Friendly Business award at the 2019 Cardiff Cycling Awards.

There are card-access dry cycle stores, maintenance stands, tools, lockers, showers and even cycle paths available on and around our campuses. Llandaff has dedicated facilities that are situated at the rear of the School of Art and Design. At Cyncoed facilities are located at the Tennis Centre.

Buddy up at 8:30am outside Plas Gwyn or Unite Receptions to ride together to Llandaff Campus in the Cardiff Met cycle convoy!

#### nextbike (OVO) UK - Exciting news!

This year we have confirmed that we have purchased 5,000 nextbike permits exclusively for Cardiff Met students to use! It's FREE for the first 30 minutes, every time you use one, as many times a day as you want, every day for a year! Llandaff Campus to City Centre is ten minutes on a nextbike. Cyncoed Campus to Roath/Cathays student areas is ten minutes on a nextbike.

We have stations on all campuses and near every Halls of Residence. You do need to deposit £5 but get that back if you leave the scheme. It is advisable to sanitise hand grips, bell and cpu etc when using a nextbike.
