2) SELF ASSESS YOUR SUBJECT KNOWLEDGE

Please have a read through the WJEC A Level specification for the language you have applied to teach. Read through the Grammar requirements (Appendix A) specifically and self-assess how much you know about each of the grammar points.

Read through the list and be honest with yourself. When you begin the PGCE MFL programme you will be expected to plan and teach lessons on a range of topic areas, so it's best that you are aware of your knowledge 'gaps' now.

Keep updating your language skills by listening and reading in the target language(s) and undertaking grammar exercises. Your language knowledge must be accurate in order to teach it effectively and clearly to pupils. A good grammar book will be invaluable. The course 'Upgrade your French/German/Spanish' by Routledge is an excellent 30-day course.

As you work through the papers, think about and write down some misconceptions or difficulties that you think pupils at GCSE or A Level may have with some of the questions. Consider the following questions:

- Why do you think certain skills are more difficult than others?
- Which skills are the most challenging for our learners?
- What are your thoughts on the set films for AS and set books for A2? How inclusive/diverse are they?
- How different or not is the specification from the GCSE's and A levels which you took?

Please could you also bring your thoughts and ideas with you in September?
